Anthony Carter established the A.C. Carter Men's Basketball Scholarship Fund at UH Mānoa with a \$100,000 endowment as a way to thank those who supported him – “The fans, the coaches, all the people who were behind me who never gave up on me. They got me to where I am right now.”



As we celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of athletics at the University of Hawai'i (UH) Mānoa we are committed to making the next 100 years even better.

The UH Mānoa Athletics Legacy Program lays the groundwork for future athletic achievements. Private philanthropic gifts are crucial to the support of student athletes and athletic programs. Income from endowed scholarships cover all or part of tuition, room and board, and fees and in many cases, make it possible for our warrior and wahine students to choose UH.

Endowment income also advances academic excellence by attracting and retaining outstanding head coaching staff through financial incentives, helping UH Mānoa remain competitive.

More and more alumni and friends are investing in UH Mānoa Athletics to ensure the next century is a winning one. By establishing named endowments, scholarships and coaching positions, our donors solidify the foundation for future success.

### LEGACY PROGRAM

When you make a Legacy gift, you are investing in student athletes and coaching staff for generations to come. A fully endowed program – in which endowment funding provides scholarship for every student athlete in every sport – is the goal of the UH Mānoa Athletics Department. Your monetary gift, invested prudently, continues to generate earnings that are used to pay for annual program expenses.

### CHOOSING YOUR LEGACY

By making a legacy investment, you are helping to endow UH Mānoa Athletics Programs in perpetuity. Gift levels include:

#### Legacy Level

A gift endowing a specific team (*which generates funds that provide scholarships for all team members*) provides the immediate impact of a fully endowed program. Each scholarship will bear the donor's name.

**A gift of \$2 million** will endow a named coaching position in football, men's basketball, and women's volleyball.

**A gift of \$1 million** will endow a named coaching position in any of the remaining sports.

#### Leadership Level

**A gift of \$250,000 or more** provides a named scholarship (*which covers tuition, room and board, and fees*) for a specific team position or a specific sport. For example, the John B. Warrior Football Scholarship for a Defensive Back.

#### Director Level

**A gift of \$35,000 – \$249,999** provides a named partial scholarship (*used toward tuition, room and board, and fees*) for a specific sport. For example, the Jane B. Wahine Volleyball Scholarship.
